Executive Summary

CoreConsult Inc. was engaged by Antigua and Barbuda Ocean Trust to conduct a study to assess the attitudes of residents regarding commercial whaling and determine the national perspective on Antigua and Barbuda's position on the matter.

The objectives of the study were to gather and evaluate the attitudes of residents on commercial whaling by examining their knowledge of the country's position on commercial whaling at international whaling meetings, and to assess public perceptions of the nation's stance on commercial whaling.

Respondents were informed that a global ban on commercial whaling (the killing of whales for profit) has been in place since 1986. And, although Antigua and Barbuda has never engaged in commercial whaling, the country has consistently supported lifting the ban and has opposed the establishment of sanctuaries where whales are protected from commercial whaling. This context was provided to ensure that respondents could give informed responses during the study.

The data collection methodology was telephone interviews, which took place between May 26, 2026, and June 3, 2026. Successful interviews were performed with 508 residents. The database of calling numbers was created by CoreConsult Inc.

Demographic highlights of the sample are as follows:

- Age: 25% of respondents were between 50–59 years.
- Education: 42% reported university as their highest level of education.
- Residence: 43% resided in the parish of Saint John.
- Employment: 60% reported being in full-time employment.
- Gender: 54% of respondents were male.
- Citizenship: 97% were citizens of Antigua and Barbuda.

The main findings of the study are summarized here.

Two-thirds of respondents (68%) were unaware that Antigua and Barbuda supports commercial whaling at International Whaling Commission (IWC) meetings. Awareness was highest among university graduates, with 43% indicating they knew of the country's position, compared with just 11% of respondents whose highest level of education was primary school.

A clear majority of respondents (64%) opposed commercial whaling, while 20% indicated that they had no opinion. Opposition was highest among respondents aged 40–49 years (68%), compared to those aged 30–39 years with 46%.

Most respondents (56%) did not support Antigua and Barbuda's continued opposition to the establishment of a whale sanctuary in the south Atlantic Ocean. Approximately one-third (32%) believed the country should maintain its current position. Male respondents (38%) were more likely than female respondents (26%) to support the country's continued opposition.

Nearly two-thirds of respondents (62%) believed that Antigua and Barbuda's continued support for commercial whaling could harm the country's international reputation. This view was most prevalent among university graduates (68%). In contrast, 31% of respondents with a primary school education believed the country's support for commercial whaling would not damage its international reputation, while respondents with a secondary school education (15%) expressed the greatest uncertainty.

Approximately, one-half of respondents (52%) believed that Antigua and Barbuda's opposition to the establishment of a south Atlantic Ocean whale sanctuary could negatively affect the country's tourism industry. By comparison, 36% did not believe there would be a negative impact, and 12% were unsure. Responses were consistent across all age groups, indicating broad agreement on the potential implications for tourism.

Sixty percent (60%) of respondents opposed Antigua and Barbuda proposing a resolution that could lead to the resumption of commercial whaling. In contrast, 29% supported such a proposal, while 11% were undecided. Opposition was highest among respondents aged 50–59 years (71%), compared with 50% of respondents aged 25–29 years.

Introduction

CoreConsult Inc carried out a survey on behalf of Antigua and Barbuda Ocean Trust to assess the attitudes of residents regarding commercial whaling and determine the national perspective on Antigua and Barbuda's position on the matter.

The objectives of the study were to gather and evaluate the attitudes of residents concerning commercial whaling by examining their knowledge of the country's position on commercial whaling at international whaling meetings, and to assess public perceptions of the nation's stance on commercial whaling.

The data collection methodology was telephone interviews using a database of calling numbers was created by CoreConsult Inc. The interviews were conducted from 26th May – 3rd June 2026. Five hundred and eight (508) surveys were successfully completed.

Respondents were informed that a global ban on commercial whaling (the killing of whales for profit) has been in place since 1986. And, although Antigua and Barbuda has never engaged in commercial whaling, the country has consistently supported lifting the ban and has opposed the establishment of sanctuaries where whales are protected from commercial whaling. This context was provided to ensure respondents were adequately informed and enabled to contribute appropriate responses during the study.

Sampling Frame

Five hundred and eight (508) residents were interviewed via the telephone. To maximize accessibility and ensure a diverse range of respondents, interviews were scheduled during convenient hours across the week. Specifically, calls were conducted Mondays through Fridays between 5:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m., allowing participation after typical working hours, and on Saturdays between 10:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m., accommodating those more available during the weekend. This structured schedule was designed to reduce non-response bias and enhance the representativeness of the sample.

Selection of interviewees

CoreConsult Inc. developed a database of calling numbers which served as the sampling frame for the study. From this database, residents were randomly selected to participate, ensuring that each resident had an equal chance of inclusion. The use of random selection was intended to minimize systematic bias and strengthen the representativeness of the sample. By employing this approach, the study sought to capture a balanced cross-section of the population, thereby enhancing the validity and generalizability of the findings.

Demographic profile of respondents

The typical respondent may be categorized in the following terms: mature male citizen with university level of education who resides in the parish of Saint John.

A snapshot of the 2011 Population and Housing Census is included to provide demographic context and facilitate comparison between the study sample and the general population.

Demographic highlights of our sample are as follows:

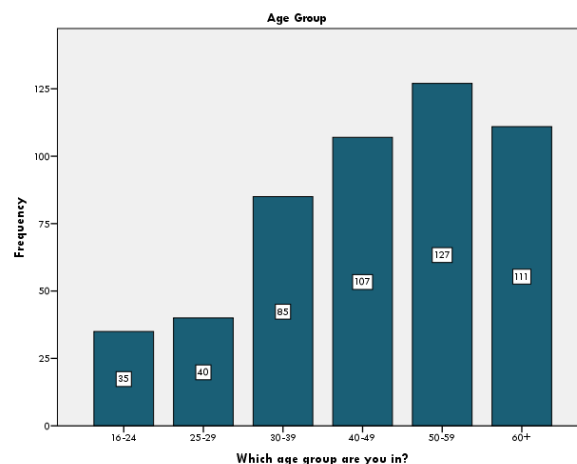
- 25% of respondents were between the ages of 50-59;
- 42% of respondents reported university as their highest level of education;
- 43% of respondents reported residing in the parish of Saint John
- 60% of respondents reported being employed full time;
- 54% of respondents were males;
- 97% of respondents were citizens.

Which age group are you in?

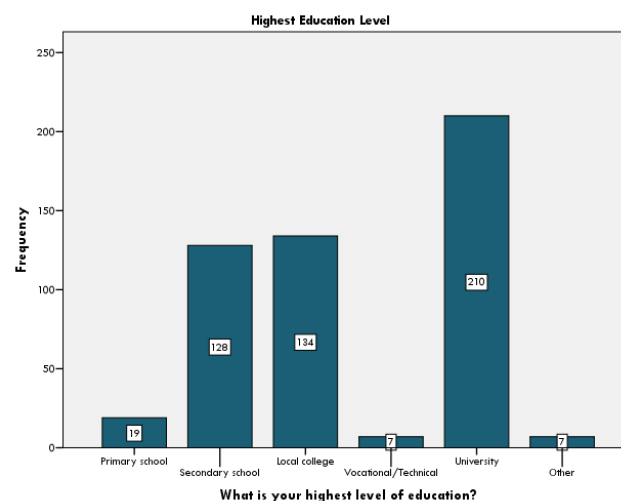

What is your highest level of education?

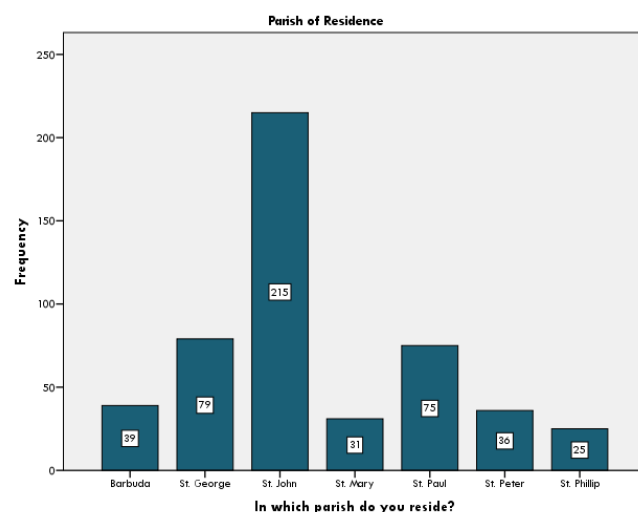

In which parish do you reside?

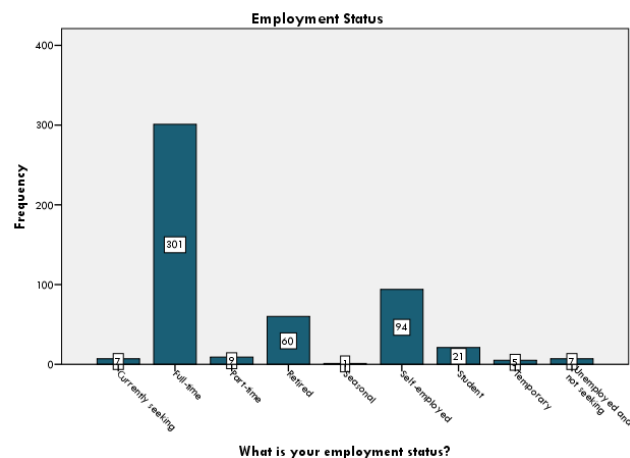

What is your employment status?

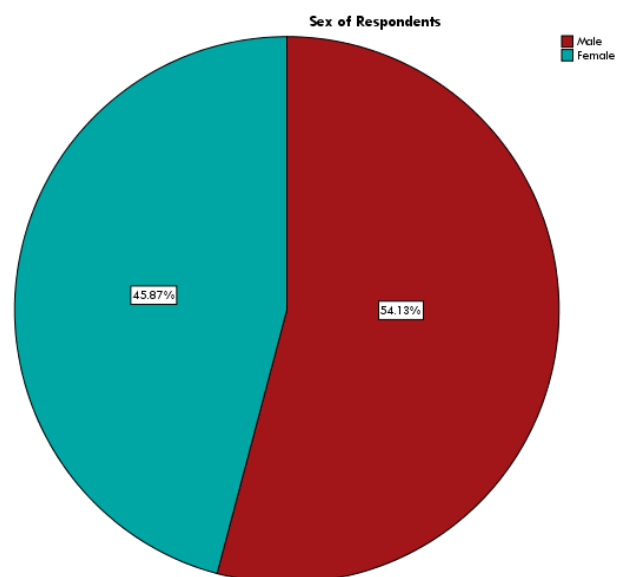

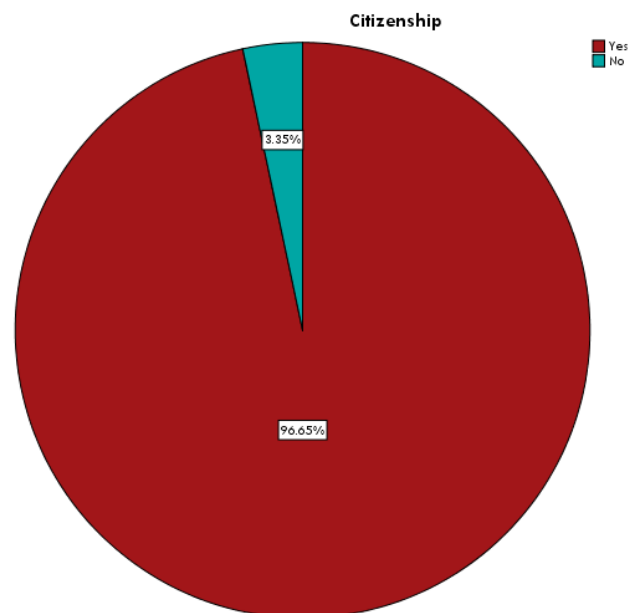

Are you a citizen of Antigua and Barbuda?

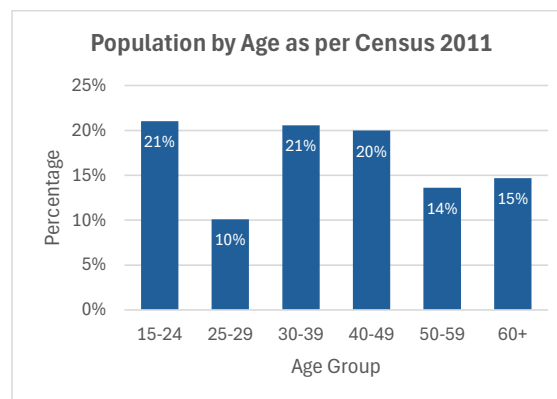

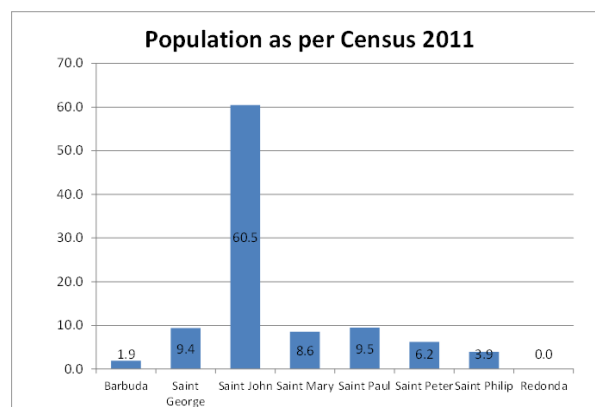

Presentation of Main Findings and Analyses

We discuss the findings as they pertain to each question asked in the survey. In addition to narrative presentation, the data is illustrated in table and chart format to show the frequency, percent, mean, median, and mode as appropriate.

All statistically significant results are reported at the 95% confidence level.

Q1. Did you know that Antigua and Barbuda supports commercial whaling at IWC meetings?

Approximately two-thirds (68%) of respondents did not know that Antigua and Barbuda supports commercial whaling at International Whaling Commission (IWC) meetings. Thirty-one percent (31%) of respondents reported knowing of the country's support for commercial whaling at IWC meetings and fewer than 2% expressed uncertainty.

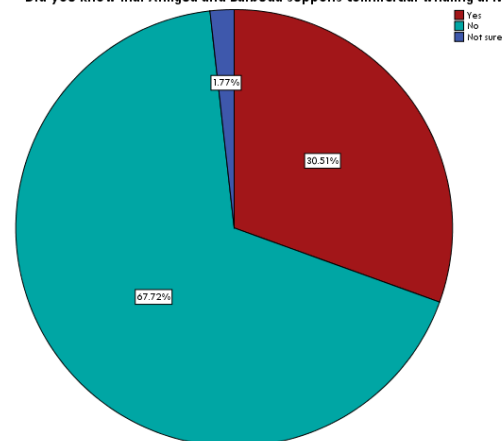
1. The generational gap is statistically significant. The vast majority of young respondents aged 16-24 (94%) were unaware of Antigua and Barbuda's stance on commercial whaling at the International Whaling Commission (IWC) meetings. In contrast, awareness was substantially higher among older demographics, with approximately half (51%) of seniors aged 60 and older reporting that they were aware of the country's pro-commercial whaling position.
2. The educational gap is statistically significant. Forty-three percent (43%) of university graduates were aware that Antigua and Barbuda supports commercial whaling at IWC meetings while 11% of primary school graduates were aware of Antigua & Barbuda's pro-commercial whaling position.
3. The parish residency gap is not statistically significant. Regardless parish of residence, majority of respondents were unaware of Antigua & Barbuda's pro-commercial whaling position.
4. The employment gap is statistically significant. Retired respondents had the highest awareness at 45% of Antigua and Barbuda's pro-commercial whaling position while "Other" (a combination of currently seeking, part-time, student, seasonal, temporary, and unemployed and not seeking) had the lowest awareness at 12%.
5. The gender gap is not statistically significant. Majority of male and female respondents were unaware of Antigua and Barbuda's stance on commercial whaling at the International Whaling Commission (IWC) meetings.

Q2. How much do you support or oppose commercial whaling?

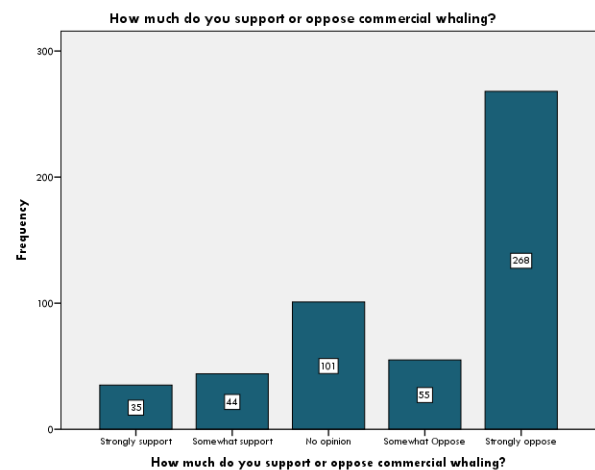
A majority of respondents (64%) expressed opposition to commercial whaling, with strong opposition accounting for 53% of responses. One-fifth (20%) of respondents neither supported nor opposed the practice, indicating that they had no opinion.

1. The generational gap is statistically significant. The strongest resistance to commercial whaling is among respondents 40-49 (68%) compared to that of respondents 30-39 years (46%).
2. The educational gap is not statistically significant. Respondents' strong aversion to commercial whaling is not determined by their education level.
3. The parish residency gap is not statistically significant. Regardless of
4. parish of residence, majority of respondents were strongly opposed to commercial whaling.
5. The employment gap is not statistically significant. Strong opposition to commercial whaling exists regardless of employment status.
6. The gender gap is not statistically significant. Most male and female respondents alike strongly oppose commercial whaling.

Q3. Do you think that Antigua and Barbuda should continue to oppose the IWC's establishment of a whale sanctuary located in the south Atlantic Ocean?

Most respondents (56%) said "No" to Antigua and Barbuda's continued opposition to the establishment of a whale sanctuary in the south Atlantic Ocean. One-third (32%) said that Antigua and Barbuda should continue to oppose, while 12% remain uncertain about whether the country should continue to oppose the IWC's proposal to establish the sanctuary.

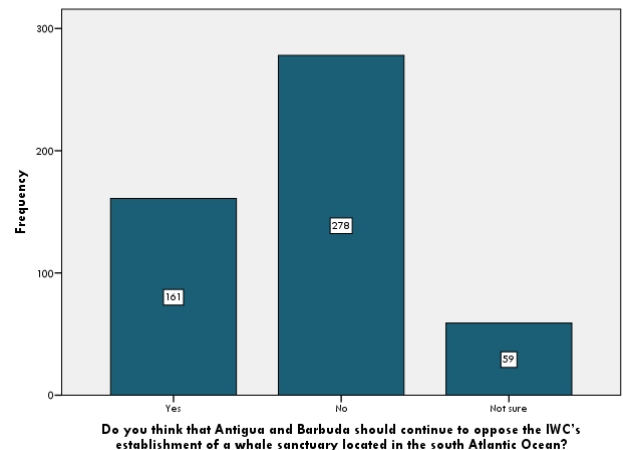
1. The generational gap is not statistically significant. The 'No' response to the continued opposition by Antigua and Barbuda to the IWC's establishing of whale sanctuary in the south Atlantic Ocean was consistent across all age groups.
2. The educational gap is not statistically significant.
3. The parish residency gap is not statistically significant.
4. The employment gap is not statistically significant.
5. The gender gap is statistically significant. A higher proportion of males (38%) supported Antigua and Barbuda's continued opposition to the IWC establishing a whale sanctuary in the south Atlantic Ocean than females (26%).

Q4. Do you think that Antigua and Barbuda's continued support for commercial whaling could harm our international reputation?

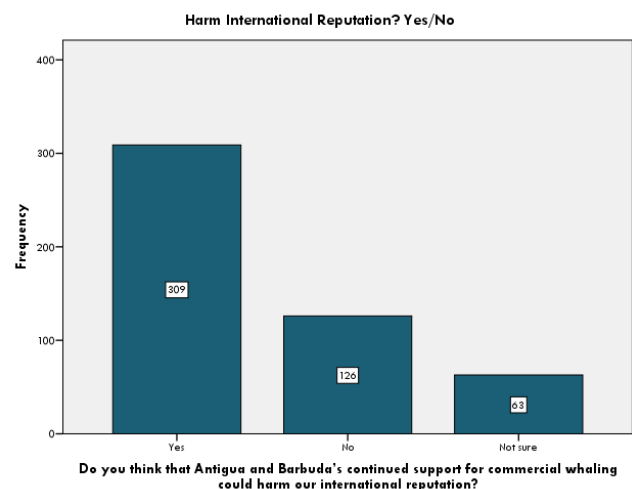
Sixty-two percent (62%) of respondents are of the view that Antigua and Barbuda's continued support for commercial whaling could harm the international reputation of the country. One-quarter (25%) of respondents disagree while 13% are unsure that continued support for commercial whaling could harm the country's international reputation.

1. The generational gap is not statistically significant. The view that Antigua and Barbuda's continued support for commercial whaling could harm the international reputation of the country was consistent across all age groups.
2. The educational gap is statistically significant. While primary school respondents (31%) disagreed and 15% of secondary school respondents expressed the most hesitation, university respondents (68%) believed that the country's ongoing support for commercial whaling would harm its international reputation.
3. The parish residency gap is not statistically significant.
4. The employment gap is not statistically significant.
5. The gender gap is statistically significant. Compared to 20% of females, a larger percentage of males (30%) do not believe that the country's support for commercial whaling will harm its international reputation.

Q5. Do you think that Antigua and Barbuda's opposition to the establishment of a whale sanctuary could negatively affect our tourism product?

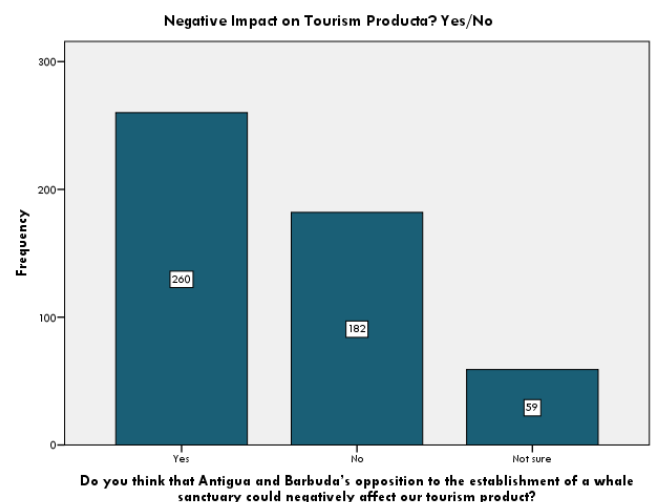
Fifty-two percent (52%) of respondents think that Antigua and Barbuda's opposition to the establishment of a whale sanctuary could have a negative impact on the country's tourism product. In contrast, 36% of respondents do not think it would have a negative effect, while 12% were unsure.

1. The generational gap is not statistically significant. The proportion of respondents selecting 'Yes' was similar across all age groups, indicating a homogeneous distribution of responses regarding the perception that Antigua and Barbuda's opposition to the establishment of a whale sanctuary could negatively impact its tourism product.
2. The educational gap is not statistically significant.
3. The parish residency gap is not statistically significant.
4. The employment gap is not statistically significant.
5. The gender gap is not statistically significant.

Q6. Do you think Antigua and Barbuda should propose a resolution to the IWC meeting that could lead to the resumption of commercial whaling?

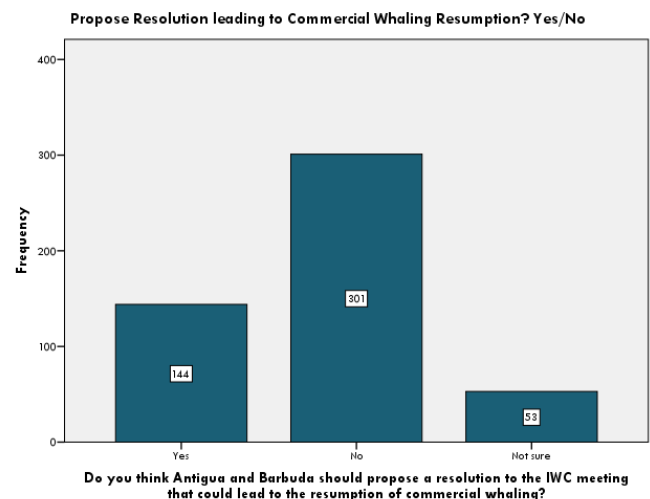
Sixty percent (60%) of respondents were opposed to Antigua and Barbuda proposing a resolution that could lead to the resumption of commercial whaling. In contrast, 29% support the proposal, while 11% are uncertain.

1. The generational gap is statistically significant. The strongest opposition to Antigua and Barbuda's proposal that could lead to resuming commercial whaling was recorded among respondents aged 50–59, with 71% expressing opposition. In comparison, 50% of respondents aged 25–29 opposed the proposal.
2. The educational gap is statistically significant. University respondents (68%) opposed resuming commercial whaling, while local college respondents showed greatest support (37%), and primary school respondents (33%) expressed the highest uncertainty.
3. The parish residency gap is not statistically significant.
4. The employment gap is not statistically significant.
5. The gender gap is not statistically significant.

Conclusion

The survey findings indicate that while public awareness of Antigua and Barbuda's support for commercial whaling at International Whaling Commission (IWC) meetings remains relatively low, there is clear public opposition to both commercial whaling and the country's current policy positions on related issues. Most respondents were unaware of the government's support for commercial whaling, suggesting a need for greater public awareness and transparency regarding the country's participation in international environmental policy.

A majority of respondents opposed commercial whaling, did not support Antigua and Barbuda's continued opposition to the establishment of a south Atlantic Ocean whale sanctuary, and rejected the idea of proposing a resolution that could lead to the resumption of commercial whaling. Furthermore, many respondents believed that the country's pro-commercial whaling stance could negatively affect its international reputation and tourism product, two areas that are critical to Antigua and Barbuda's economic development.

The findings also reveal important demographic differences. Higher levels of education were associated with greater awareness of the country's position and stronger concern about its potential international reputational consequences. While some variation existed across age groups and gender, opposition to commercial whaling and concern about its broader impacts were evident across the population.

Overall, the results suggest that public opinion is largely at odds with Antigua and Barbuda's current position on commercial whaling and related IWC policies.

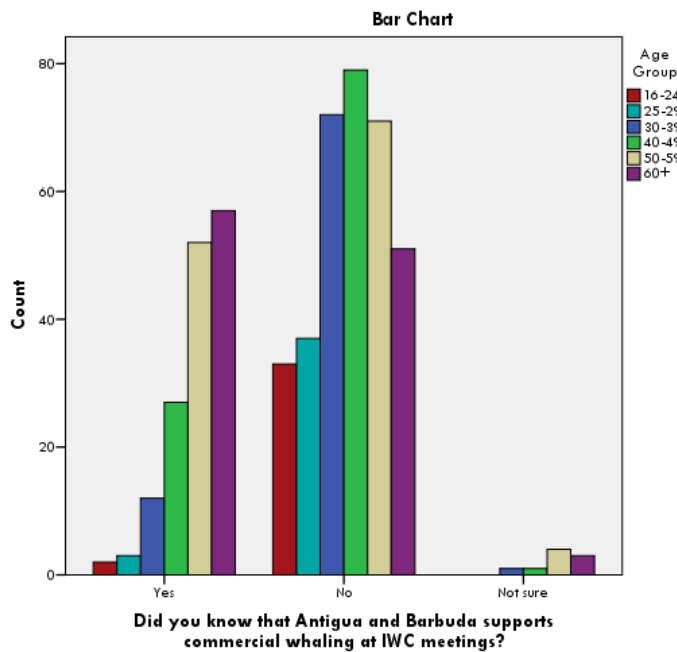

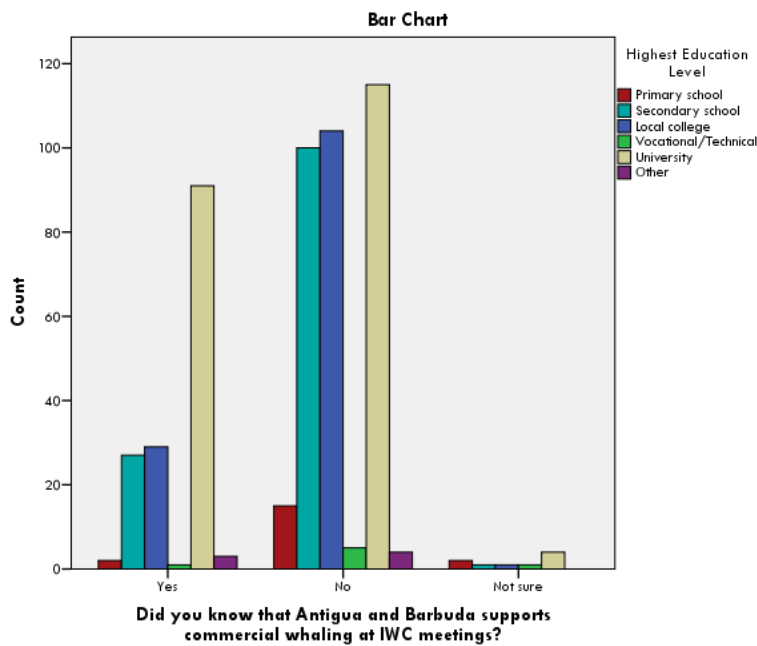

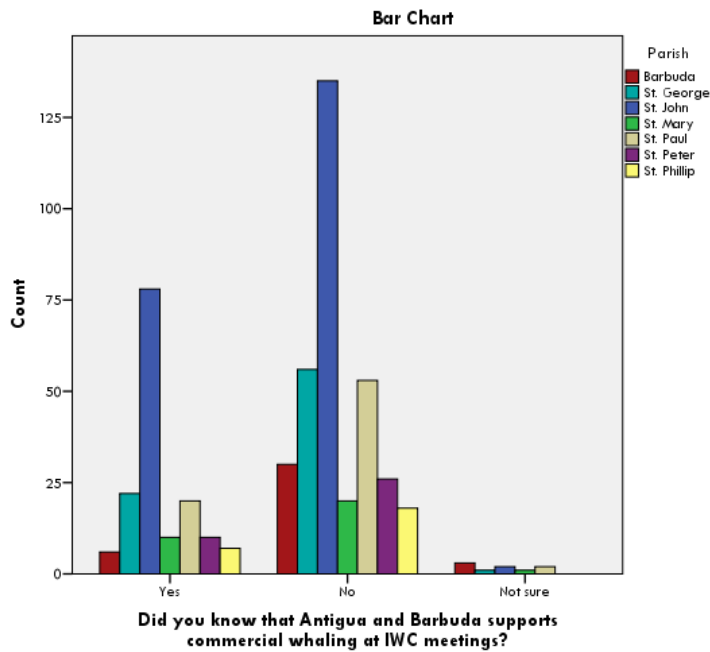

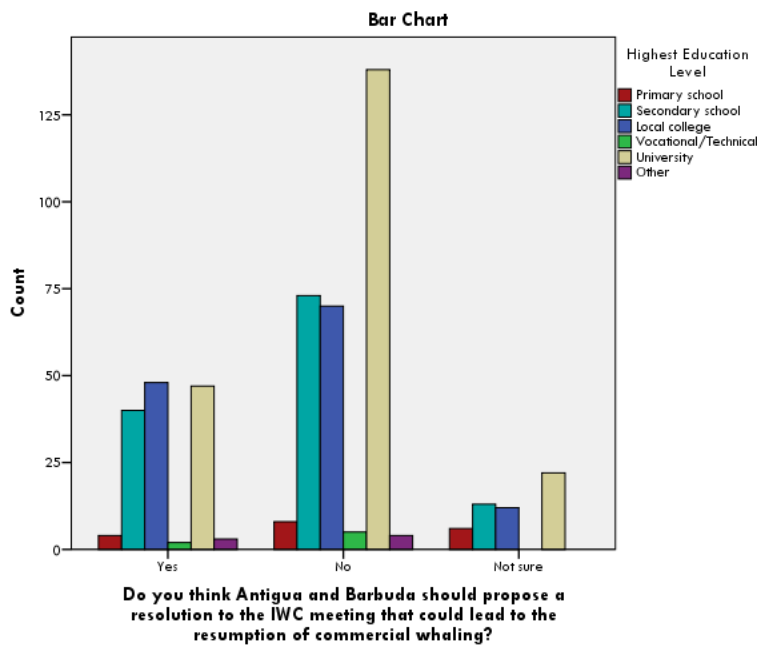

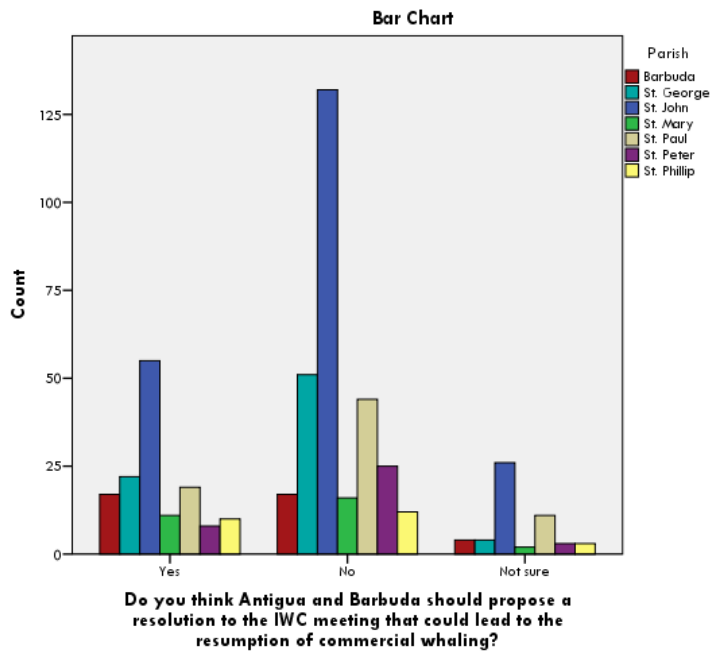

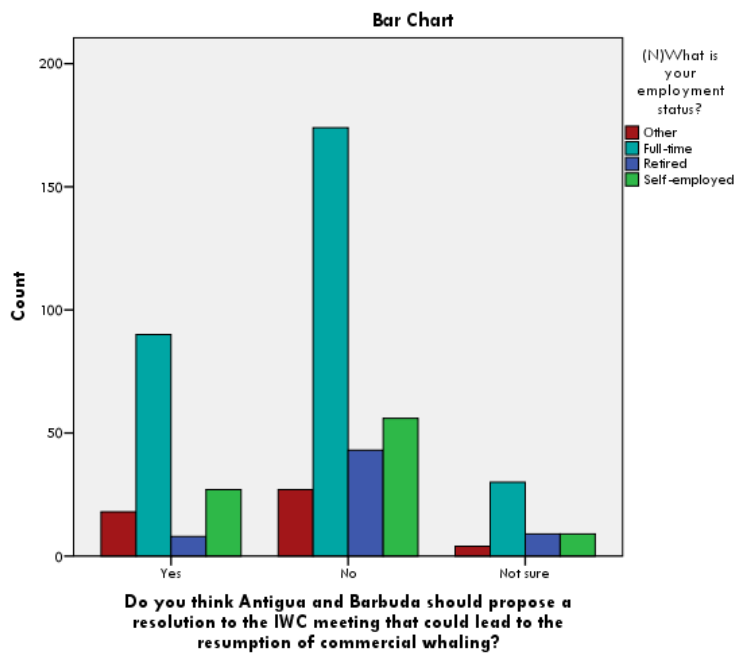
